

But if you really want to send in something, we ask that you limit your gifts to small, inedible objects like pencils, stickers, tattoos, erasers, silly bands or other very inexpensive items. Instead of a food item, please consider sending something for the class to enjoy such as: A game for the classroom, a classroom book (A nice touch would be having your child pick it out, sign it, and date it.), a classroom set of items for each child to keep such as pencils, pens, erasers, markers, etc.
